## AMERICA'S INDEBTEDNESS

I have mentioned on many occasions that I love FLAGS and I love America. In addition, without Presbyterians, there would be no America (about half the soldiers and officers in the Revolution were Presbyterians of Scotch / Irish descent).

Rev. Bruce Theilman, a pastor at 1st Presbyterian in Pittsburgh, wrote this in 1987 and delivered it at Waynesburg College. I share it with you:

"I say to you this morning that I am a little bit sick of those Americans who . . . well, take one for example. He gets up in the morning and takes off his pajamas which were invented by the East Indians. He takes a shower using soap which was first developed in Gaul. He shaves his face, and the razor was invented by the Sumerians. The blade in the razor is steel, and steel was first developed in Turkistan. He goes downstairs, and he has breakfast. The tablecloth is from the cotton grown in Alabama. The cutlery that he uses is made up of elements brought from Zimbabwe and Canada and Peru. The tea he drinks is from Ceylon; or if it is coffee, it comes from Columbia. He has a slice of Canadian bacon and two eggs sunny – side up; and those eggs come from chickens fed by that which we have taken from the waters off Chile, Japan and Iceland. He puts on his suit, which was first developed in the Asian steppes, and ties his necktie, which is a holdover from a ceremonial shawl worn in the 7th century Croatia. He puts on his hat, first developed in East Asia. He picks up his umbrella, thought up by the Chinese, gets onto the bus and pays his fare with coins first used in ancient Lydia. On the way to town, he reads his paper which was developed by the Chinese. The letters on the page are there in Arabic script, and the printing process used to print that paper was developed by the Germans. And after he has read the morning paper he is disgusted with the rest of the world; so he bows his head and prays to a Hebrew God in an Indo- European tongue and he thanks God that he is 100 percent and the decimal system came from the Greeks – American.

The fact of the matter is that we are all one people on this Earth. So, when I plead for the service that Jesus demonstrated, I plead for our common indebtedness.

Our origin, our destiny, our responsibility, call us to be part of the guild of the knotted towel (which Jesus used to wash the Apostles' feet)."

## **If Jesus could speak to America**

**Some pastors refrain from preaching on political topics. However, on national holidays and in national election years, many parishioners yearn for some Biblical perspective.**

**First, we must establish Jesus' authority to speak to political issues.**

**One of the revitalized heresies is compartmentalizing life into areas where God supposedly should and should not be involved. This was the argument in St. Matthew 22:15-22. On the surface Jesus' response seems to justify a separation of church (render to God) and state (render to Caesar).**

**But what is Jesus really saying?**

**According to Jacques Ellul in *The Subversion of Christianity* (p. 114) if the Caesars, some of whom claimed to be god, are owed obedience, loyalty and a percentage of wages, then the true and Most High God is owed so much more...everything!**

**Jesus in the Matthew passage above echoes Psalm 24 (the entire earth belongs to the LORD) and Paul in Philippians 2:9 asserts that God has bestowed on Jesus the name/authority above all others. Therefore, Jesus as Lord claims the right not only to talk about any country, but also to demand allegiance.**

**Below are some other statements which Jesus might pose to America.**

### **1. Your nation is not to become your God.**

**Most of us are proud of our nation, and pledging allegiance to something higher than our country sounds subversive. But the first commandment includes putting no other gods above the LORD. If any economic or political system were to conflict with the way of the LORD, it must be superseded and transformed.**

### **2. God gives no automatic favorite-nation status.**

**Our Pilgrim fathers looked upon America as a place of destiny. Across the years the United States has surely played an important role in combating dangerous "isms." However, recall that the downfall of the nation of Israel always came when Israel began to believe it was chosen on merit to enjoy privilege. Instead Israel was chosen by grace to carry out great responsibility: "I will give you as a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." (Isaiah 49:6)**

### **3. Your land is only loaned to you.**

**Jesus was fond of referring to the book of Deuteronomy, and he might remind us of chapter 8:11-20 where we are told not to be haughty and say, "By our own power and might we have gotten all this." When we read to the end of the passage, we find "if you do forget the LORD your God...you shall surely perish." (v.19)**

### **4. It is okay to develop a fresh capacity for anger.**

There are numerous examples in the Gospels precipitating Jesus' cutting sarcasm and anger, just as there are lies and actions today that should simply outrage us. Ephesians 4:26 reads: "Be angry, but do not sin." It is appropriate for us to have righteous indignation in the face of injustices. This should spur us toward reversing the situation, but our anger should not fester into hatred.

5. Don't assume America's "way" is always the best.

The infant mortality rate has been lower in Nepal than in cities such as Pittsburgh and Washington, DC. A worker in the United States is 36 times more likely to be killed on the job than a worker in Sweden. In Canada in 2012, the leading candidate for Prime Minister spent only \$236,000. Yet, more than six billion dollars is spent on the American presidential election process.

6. Don't expect your future to go smoothly.

It is a puzzle to many why Jesus, with a gospel of forgiveness and love, should have stirred up such bitter hatred among the most religious and virtuous people in his nation. But in St. Matthew 10:34 Jesus had warned his followers that he came to bring not peace ... but a sword. He is always on the cutting edge! The Kingdom Rule of God will eventually overthrow any and all old orders in which self, not the Savior, is sovereign. St. Luke 16:16 (RSV) reminds us that everyone who enters the Kingdom of God enters violently.

7. You haven't seen anything yet.

America has lots of resources and perhaps still more opportunities, yet the Bible looks ahead to the new earth that Jesus will usher in. I Corinthians 2:9 proclaims the promise first given in Isaiah 64:4 that no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor heart imagined, what has been prepared for those who love the Most High God.

The best future for the United States is not the agenda of the elephant nor of the donkey but that of the Lamb ... of God.

### **FAMOUS PRESBYTERIAN'S WITNESS FROM THE MOON**

July 20th will mark the 57nd anniversary of the Apollo 11 moon landing. Astronauts Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin were the first men to set foot on the lunar surface while Michael Collins orbited in the command module Columbia.

Many Americans recall Armstrong's words as he stepped from the lunar module to the moon's surface: "That's one small step for [a] man, one giant leap for mankind."

A few minutes later, Aldrin, an elder at his Presbyterian Church in Texas, made this public statement: "This is the LM (lunar module) pilot. I'd like to take this opportunity to ask every person listening in, whoever and wherever they may be, to pause for a moment and contemplate the events of the past few hours and to give thanks in his or her own way."

At this point the radio communication was cut, but Aldrin read from the Gospel of John 15:5: "I am the vine. You are the branches. Whoever remains in me, and I in him, will bear much fruit; for you can do nothing without me." Aldrin then celebrated the Lord's Supper on the moon. He had made prior arrangements with his pastor to provide him with a consecrated communion wafer and a small vial of communion wine for him to take to the moon.

Aldrin had intended for his Communion Service to be broadcast, but NASA declined permission to do so. The Space Administration was in a legal battle at the time with atheist Madelyn Murray O'Hare who had objected to the Apollo 8 crew reading the Genesis account of creation as they orbited the moon at Christmas time in 1968. Commenting on his experience, Aldrin said, "I ate the tiny toast and swallowed the wine. I gave thanks for the intelligence and spirit that had brought two young pilots to the Sea of Tranquility. It was interesting to me to think that the very first liquid ever poured on the moon and the very first food eaten there were the communion elements."

Reflecting on the experience in his 2009 book entitled *Magnificent Desolation: The Long Journey Home from the Moon*, Aldrin wrote, "Perhaps, if I had it to do over again, I would not choose to celebrate communion. Although it was a deeply meaningful experience for me, it was a Christian sacrament, and we had come to the moon in the name of all mankind – be they Christians, Jews, Muslims, animists, agnostics, or atheists. But at the time I could think of no better way to acknowledge the enormity of the Apollo 11 experience than by giving thanks to God."

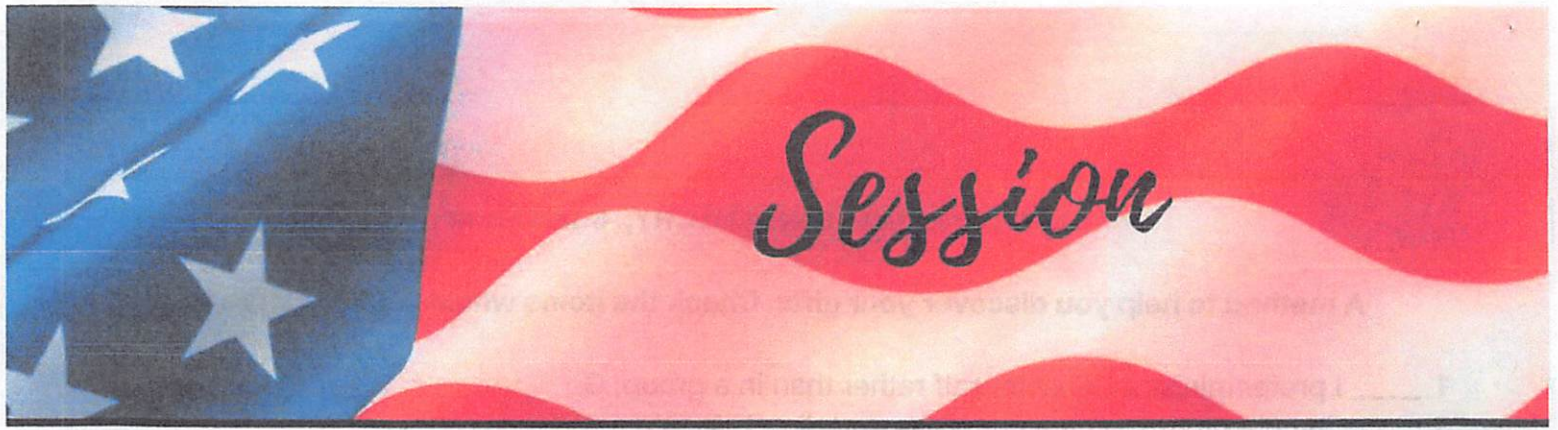

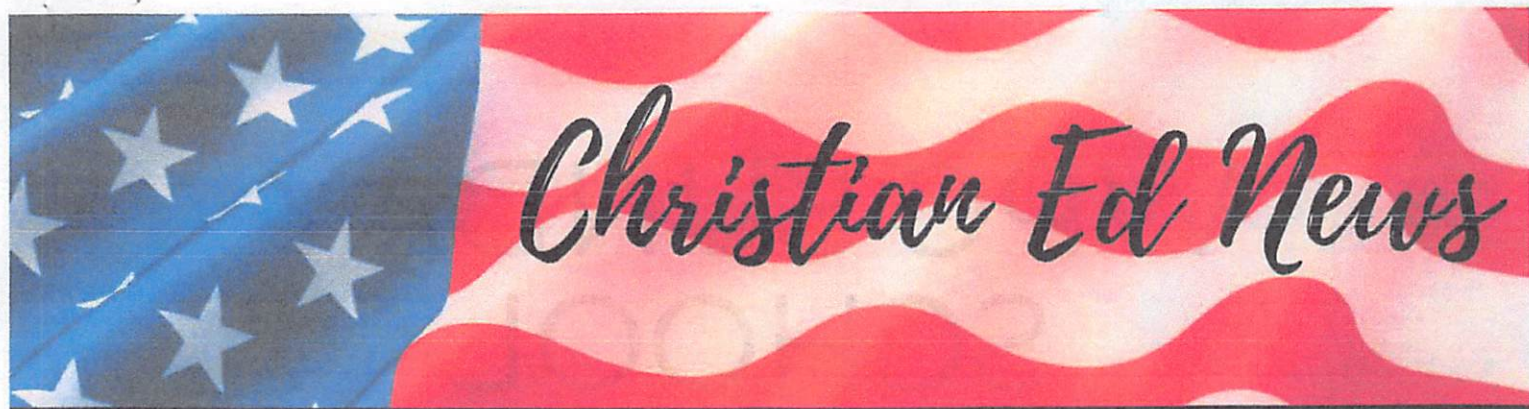

## **Broadcast All His Wonders! [1 Chronicles 16:9 – The Message] On the Alaskan Airwaves with Roland Maust, Issue #49, June 2026**

Dear friends of Alaska and precious supporters of Broadcast All His Wonders!

In these swiftly changing days of AI, machine learning, and cybernetics, supporters of Christian radio are increasingly wondering if AM and FM over the airwaves is still relevant. What a great question! Let's find out ...

### **How Effective is Christian Radio?**

When radio swept America in the 1920s, it was all the rage. Then television burst on the scene after World War II, and pundits opined that radio was doomed. Ignoring the doomsayers, radio grew in popularity.

The advent of the internet prompted a new crop of pessimists predicting radio's end. Undeterred, broadcasters continued to flourish, adding streaming to their toolbox. Now Artificial Intelligence shows up; do you think radio is worried? Take a look at this latest 2026 Pew Research Center survey, then decide for yourself:

- \* About 4000 of the some 17,000 AM and FM stations registered with the FCC (23.5%) are religious.
- \* 98% of Americans live within broadcast range of a Christian radio station.
- \* 62% of listeners choose religious broadcasting because they find it spiritually fulfilling and meaningful.
- \* 39% of listeners listen for life transforming advice and guidance.
- \* 30% of listeners tune in for religious services and sermons. And then there's my personal favorite...
- \* 9% listen simply because someone else is listening to that particular radio station.

Here is just one example of radio's immense impact, this in the Asia Pacific Rim region. Reach Beyond Australia (formerly HCJB World Radio) broadcasts the Gospel in 30 languages to 442 unreached people groups (numbering some 969 million people), most in countries closed to the entrance of traditional missionaries.

American Christian radio does face one significant challenge: the graying of many of its premiere leaders:

On-the-air broadcasting successfully survived the passing of the generation of radio ministers that I grew up hearing (men like Billy Graham, M. R. DeHaan, Charles Fuller, Theodore Epp, J. Vernon McGee and Robert C. Cook to name just a few) and emerged even stronger in the process. Some who have passed away (such as McGee, Dobson, and Sproul) still continue to air previously recorded programming, while farsighted McGee even planned to continue his broadcasts during the Tribulation Period!

Please actively pray that God will empower a new generation of radio pastors and Bible expositors (like Mark Jobe, president of Moody Bible Institute and his Bold Steps program) to carry on this powerful ministry.

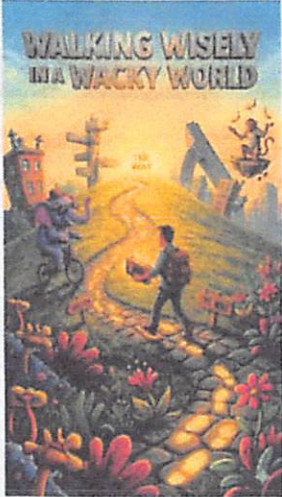
### **Facing the Future Head-On**

That's why I am so intent on creating a new generation of programming for KCAM listeners and beyond...

\* **Weird History:** 90-second fun historical tidbits, exposing listeners to the delightfully strange world in which we live. Series 1 has been airing for the past two years, with Series 2 due to broadcast in early 2027.

\* **First Thoughts:** Quotes from Christian writers and pastors gently awaken listeners with thoughts of Jesus. These 1-minute mini-commentaries have aired for the past 9 months at 6:08 a.m. Monday-Friday.

\* **Walking Wisely in a Wacky World** – 3-minute audio “breakfast devotionals” at 8:06 a.m. Monday-Friday, a brief Bible study built around a Weird History that drives the Gospel home in a unique and memorable way. While these continue to be produced, 252 of them are already recorded and being aired. 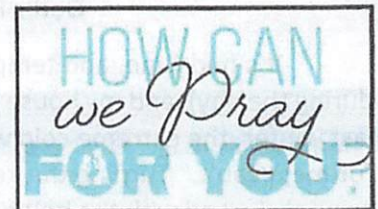

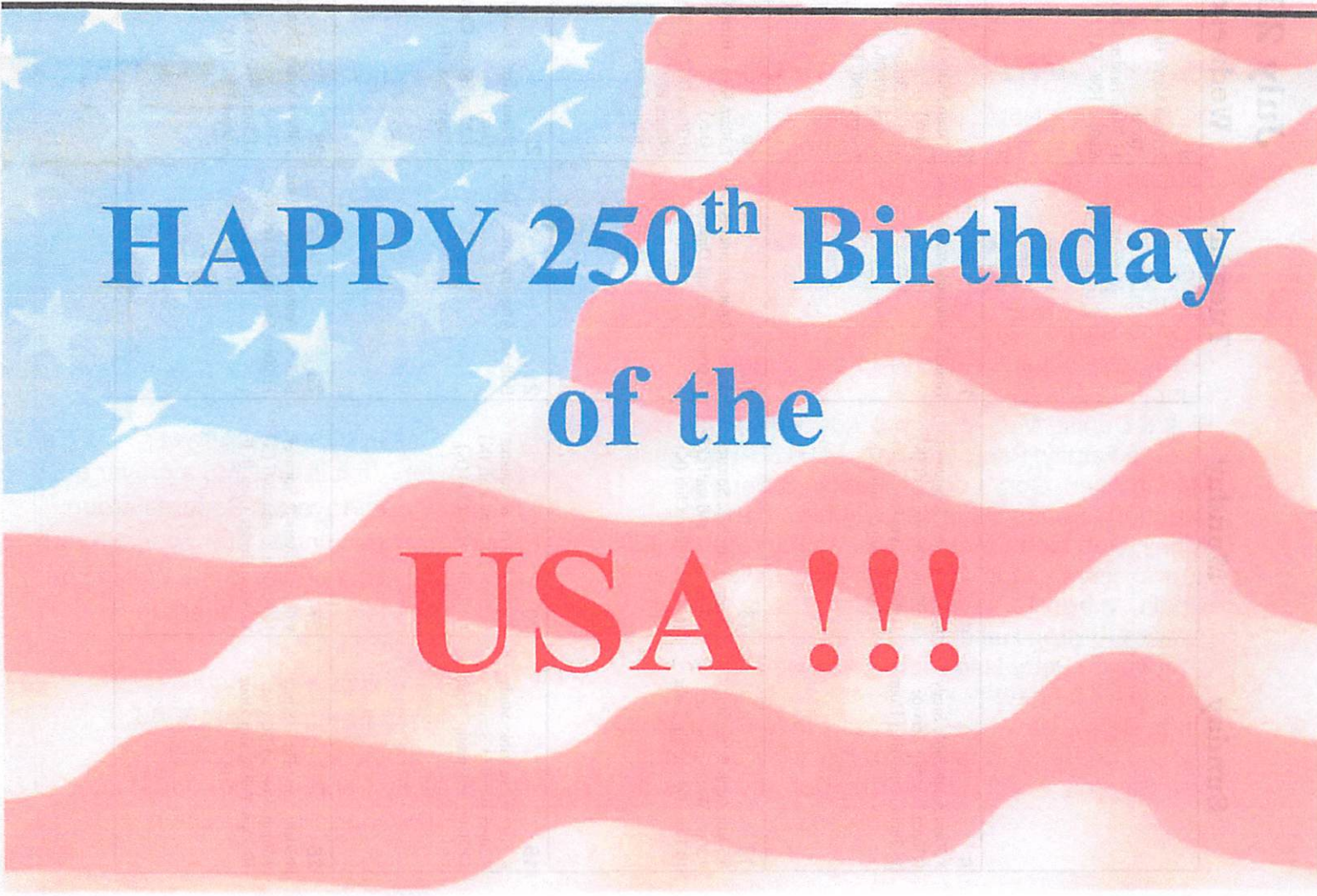
