#### Per Capita-

In the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), "per capita" refers to an annual permember apportionment that congregations pay to their Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly. This contribution helps fund the administrative and missional costs of these larger governing bodies of the church.

WPC, based upon its membership rolls, is the fifth largest church in the Redstone Presbytery. Thus, we have a larger obligation to it. Our per capita is \$47 per member. Usually our "Per Capita" envelopes are green and in the 1st quarter's packet. However, WPC pays the per capita quarterly. Thus far, WPC has paid \$8,000 (\$4,000 each quarter). We have a remaining \$8,000 commitment to the Presbytery in over the next six months.

If you do not have your "Per Capita" envelope, you can just write on the memo line of your check, "Per Capita."
